PROJECT PURPOSE

To enhance safety and resiliency by removing and replacing the existing signal mast arms.



PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Replace the existing signal mast arms.
- Provide queue detection camera for Southwest Joan Jefferson Way eastbound traffic.
- Reconstruct concrete curb ramps to comply with American with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.
- Repave and restripe the intersection.
- Remove existing brick crosswalk pavers and replace with new pavement.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

- All work will be done in phases to reduce the impacts of construction on the community.
- Sidewalk detours will be provided to maintain safe pedestrian access during construction.
- Temporary lane closures will occur during non-peak hours to minimize impacts on traffic.

CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION

- Anticipated Begin Construction: **Spring 2028**
- Anticipated End Construction: **Winter 2029**
- Estimated Construction Cost: **\$1.5M**
