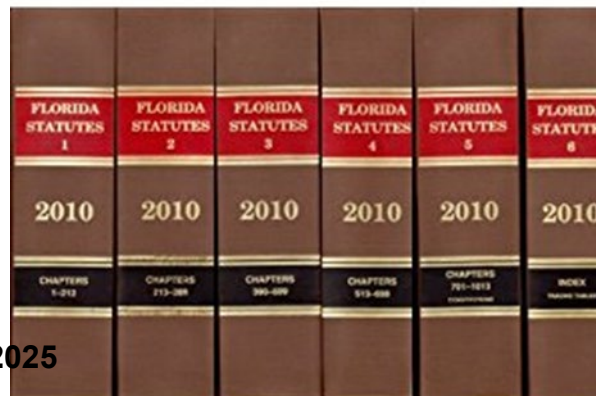

TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED

Florida Statute 427.011(1) defines TD as:

“Those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation and are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, social activities, or other life-sustaining activities, or children who are handicapped or high-risk or at-risk.”



WHO DO WE SERVE?

- Older Adults
- Persons with disabilities
- People with low income
- At-Risk Children

These qualified individuals rely on others to access health care, employment, education, and other activities in their community; and have limited transportation options to participate in these activities.



THEY COULD NEED A RIDE TO...

- Medical Services
- Work
- School
- Grocery Store
- Life Sustaining/Other



TD Program Foundation

In 1979, Legislature created the program to be “fully responsive to the needs” of this population.

Legislature created CTD and TD Trust Fund in 1989.

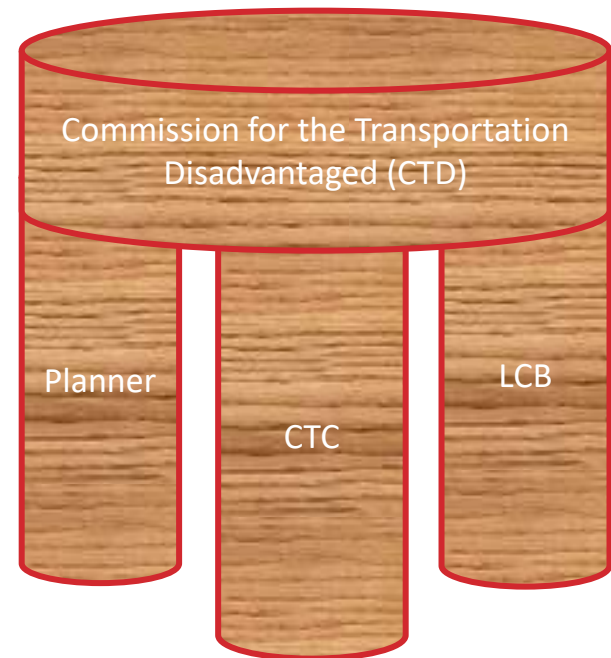
The purpose was to “coordinate” transportation services in each county in Florida.

Implemented by three primary entities at local level:

- Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) – Oversees the delivery of TD services in designated county or multi-county area.
- Planning Agency (Planner) – Coordinates planning activities for local TD program.
- Local Coordinating Board (LCB) – Represents stakeholders and advises on the delivery of TD services.

CTD also works with state/local partners or “purchasing agencies” to coordinate funding for these services.

The “Three-Legged Stool” of Coordination





What is “Coordinated Transportation”?

“Coordination” is the arrangement of transportation “in a manner that is cost-effective, efficient, and reduces fragmentation and duplication of services” (s. 427.011, F.S.).

For example, an individual may have access to medical transportation through Medicaid but requires another funding source to access employment.

Paratransit (demand-response) trips that are not “sponsored” by any other agency or provided as an extension of the fixed-route system may be purchased under the TD Trust Fund.

If TD riders are physically able to access the fixed-route system, TD funds may be used to purchase bus passes (more cost-effective than paratransit services).

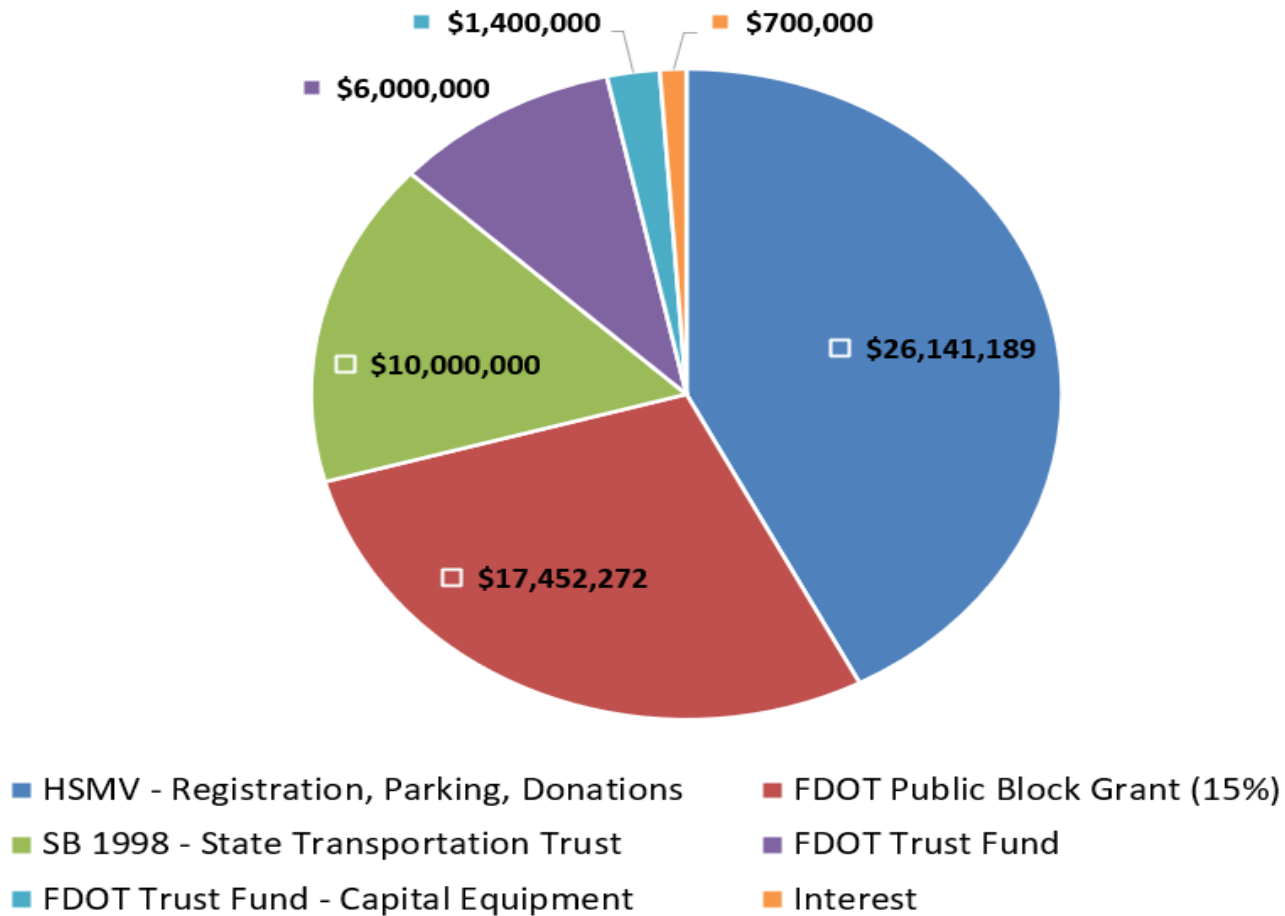
COMMISSION FOR THE TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED (CTD)

- **The CTD is assigned to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)**
 - Per F.S. Chapter 427, and with CS/CS/SB 1380, the (CTD) board membership includes four state agencies, two county managers or administrators, and five representatives from various industry backgrounds.
 - Functions as an independent agency responsible for the coordination of transportation services for the Transportation Disadvantaged.
 - Develops policies and procedures for the TD Program
 - Designates and appoints the Planning Agency
 - Approves the appointments of CTCs
 - Provides funding for TD services



Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund Revenues FY23-24

CTD Grant Programs

Trip & Equipment Grant – Annually allocates funding to 67 counties for CTCs to purchase trips, bus passes, and capital equipment.

- Legislature appropriated \$53 million for State Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24

Planning Grant – Annually allocates approximately \$1.8 million to support planning activities for local TD programs.

“Shirley Conroy” Rural Area Capital Assistance Grant – Competitive funding for CTCs to purchase capital equipment for TD services.

- FDOT transfers \$1.4 million each year for CTD to award funding.

Innovative Service Development Grant – Competitive funding for CTCs to test new services that increase access for TD riders, enhance cross-county mobility, or reduce barriers to fixed-route system.

- CTD awarded \$4.9 million for 12 projects for FY 2023-24



DESIGNATED OFFICIAL PLANNING AGENCY (DOPA)

- **Martin Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the Designated Official Planning Agency for Martin County.**
 - Martin MPO assists the Commission at the local level in accomplishing the coordination of transportation services to the TD population.
 - Martin MPO Tasks include:
 - Staffs and appoints members to the LCB-TD.
 - Performs administrative tasks – Schedules/Advertises Quarterly LCB meetings, transcribes meeting minutes and provides staff support to the TD Program.
 - Facilitates the procurement of the CTC and recommends approval by the CTD.
 - Works with CTC and LCB in developing the TD Service Plan.
 - Reviews the CTC's Annual Operating Report and submits to the LCB each year.



COMMUNITY TRANSPORTATION COORDINATOR (CTC)

- **Community Transportation Coordinator plans, administers, monitors, coordinates, arranges and delivers coordinated Transportation Disadvantaged services originating in their designated service area**
 - Operates centralized call center
 - Determines transportation eligibility
 - Schedules and coordinates trips
 - Develops a Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan with Local Coordinating Board.



COORDINATED TRANSPORTATION SERVICES IN FY22-23 (AOR)

Ridership – Approximately 11.6 million trips were provided to nearly 193,000 riders within the TD population.

Trips by Purpose – 4 million (35%) of all reported trips supported life-sustaining activities and 2.5 million (22%) trips supported medical activities.

Trips by Service Type – 6.6 million (57%) of all reported trips were delivered by the fixed-route system and the remaining 5 million (43%) were paratransit trips.

- 203,814 of reported trips were delivered by Taxicab or Transportation Network Companies (TNCs), such as Uber and Lyft.

LCB MEMBERSHIP

The Chair of the LCB must be a local elected official. Vice Chair is elected by the LCB members.

- Two citizen advocates (One must be a user of the system)
- Representative for children at-risk
- Florida Department of Elderly Affairs
- For profit transportation industry
- Regional Workforce Development board
- Local Medical Community

- Agency for People with Disabilities



PURPOSE AND DUTIES OF THE LCB-TD

Purpose

- Identify local service needs
- Provide information, advice and direction to the CTC on the coordination of services

Duties

- Hold one annual public workshop
- Annually evaluate the CTC's performance
- Annually review and approve the Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan (TDSP), LCB By-Laws, Complaint and Grievance Procedures, Trip-Rate model, Annual Operating Report, and the CTC Trip & Equipment Grant
- Review and approve of the CTC's Quarterly Progress Reports
- Participate in a minimum of four quarterly meetings
- Works with the CTC to establish trip priorities

SUNSHINE AMENDMENT, PUBLIC RECORDS AND ETHICS LAW

- **Florida's Government in the Sunshine Law, commonly referred to as the Sunshine Law (s. 286.011, F.S.), provides a right of access to governmental proceedings of public boards or commissions at both the state and local levels.**
- **The law is equally applicable to elected and appointed boards; and applies to any gathering of two or more members of the same board to discuss some matter which will foreseeably come before that board for action.**
- **There are 3 basic requirements of the Sunshine Law:**
 - **meetings of public boards or commissions must be open to the public;**
 - **reasonable notice of such meetings must be given; and**
 - **minutes of the meetings must be taken and promptly recorded.**

SUNSHINE AMENDMENT, PUBLIC RECORDS AND ETHICS LAW

- **The Sunshine Law was designed to protect the public from closed-door decision making.**
- **Board members are not allowed to discuss business related items with each other outside of a regularly scheduled meeting.**
- **It applies to communications between two or more individuals on the same board or committee relating to matters that may foreseeably come before them for a vote.**
- **These communications include face-to-face communications, faxes, email, social media, texts messages, hand-written messages, etc...**

SUNSHINE AMENDMENT, PUBLIC RECORDS AND ETHICS LAW

- **The LCB is also responsible for obeying the Public Records Law.**
- **It covers any document that relates to the business of the LCB, whether it be an email, social media, text message, word processing documents, letter or anything that can be portrayed as a document that can be provided and read in the course of business.**
- **Any and all documents that are shared between the LCB and MPO Staff can be made available upon a public records request.**



SUNSHINE AMENDMENT, PUBLIC RECORDS AND ETHICS LAW

Regarding Code of Ethics, there are two main items:

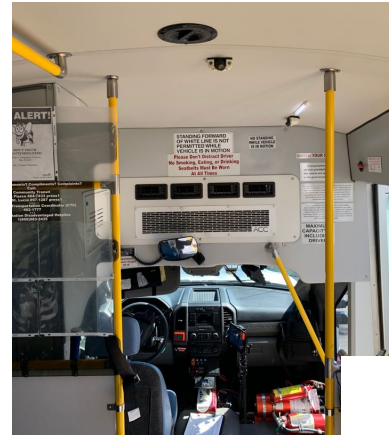
- **You are prohibited from soliciting or accepting anything of value, such as a gift, reward, promise of future employment, favor, or service.**
- **You are required to vote on all matters that come before the Board so long as you are present and have no voting conflicts with the item being voted on.**
 - **You are prohibited from voting in an official capacity on any item which you are aware of would inure to your own special private gain or loss. (Voting conflict)**

LCB develops the Complaint and Grievance Procedures and reviews/updates it annually

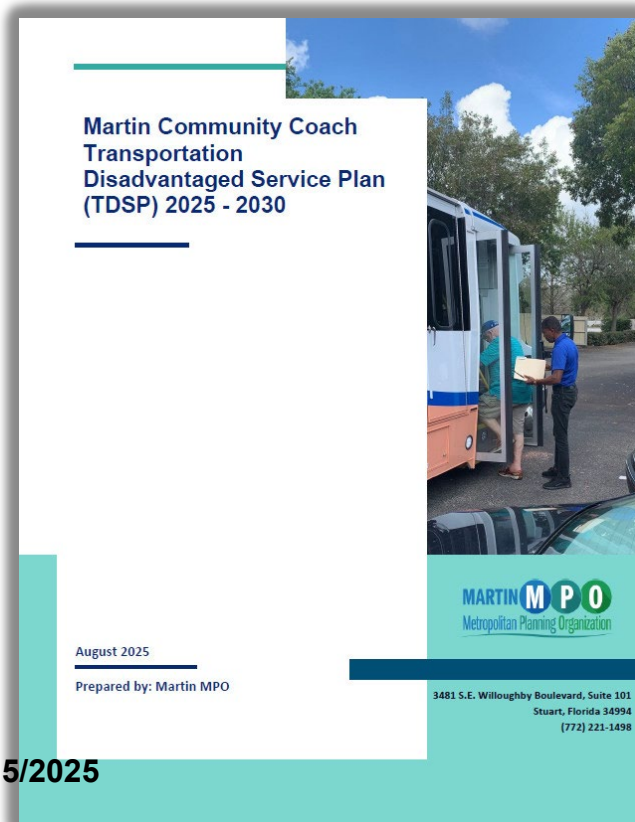
- Complaint – Customer complaining about service.

- Rider Grievances must be in writing
- LCB must make known to whom & where grievances are to be sent

TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED SERVICE PLAN (TDSP)

The Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan (TDSP) serves as a comprehensive operational plan, defining the framework that governs Transportation Disadvantaged services in Martin County, Florida.



CTD ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA GUIDELINES

Adopted May 22, 1997

At a minimum:

- No other funding available
- No other means of transportation is available
- Cannot utilize public transit
- Physical or mental disability
- Age (As specified by the CTC and the LCB)
- Income status is a specified percent of the poverty level
- No self-declarations allowed
- Ability to pay

LCB ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

At a minimum, an applicant must meet one of the following criteria:

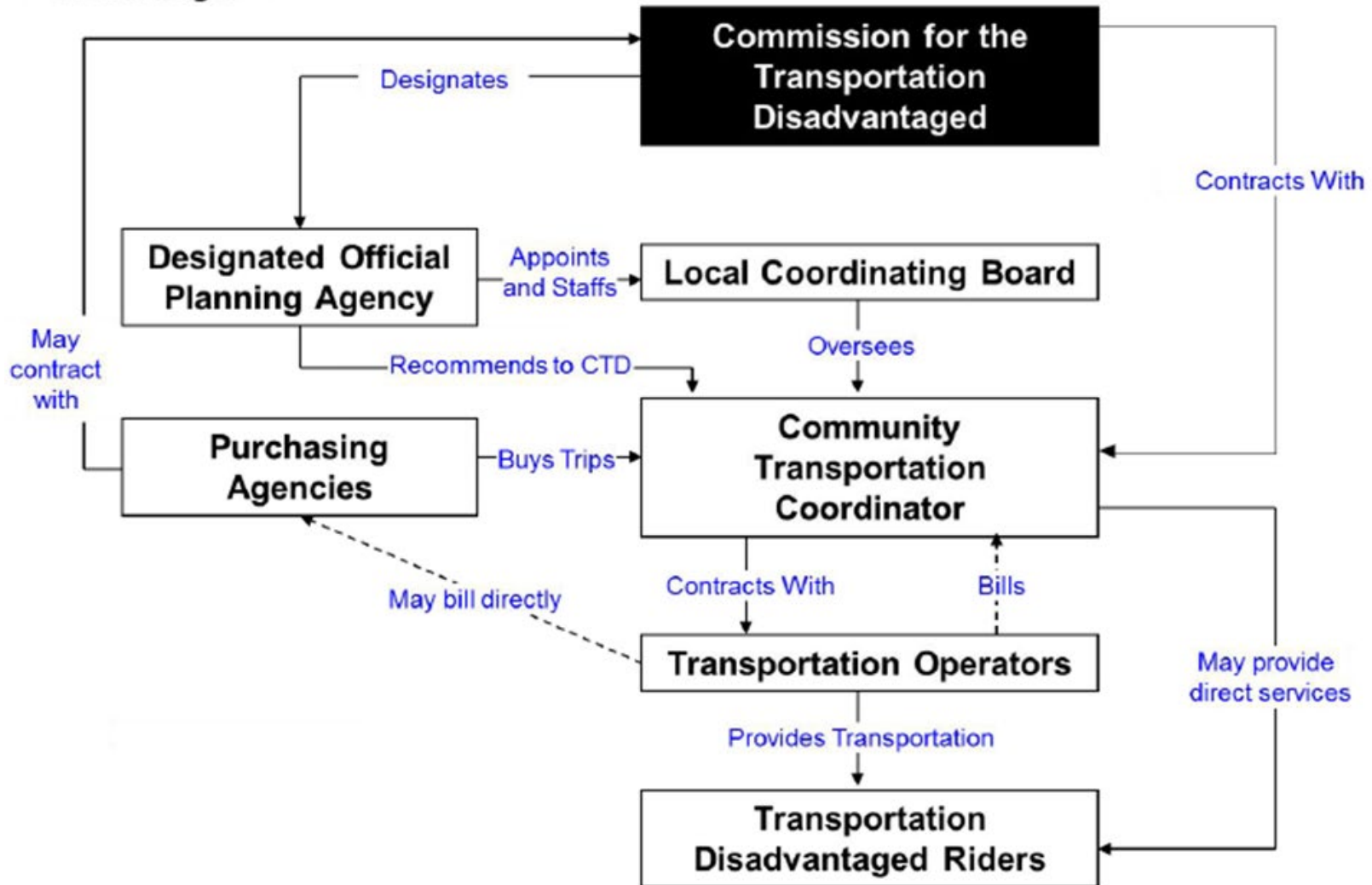
- Member must be 65 or older
- Member must be at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level Scale
- Member must have a physician document the disability (and assistive devices required when transporting the member)
- A child with a documented disability or “at risk”
